Game night is a gift of time. The real reward of game night occurs in adolescence. It starts while a child is two or three, but the real rewards are reaped when your child is in their early teens. Put it in place now. Get an armful of age appropiate games and take time each week to play them with your child. You will benefit this week and for years to come. So playing together is a gift.
